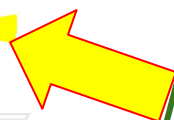

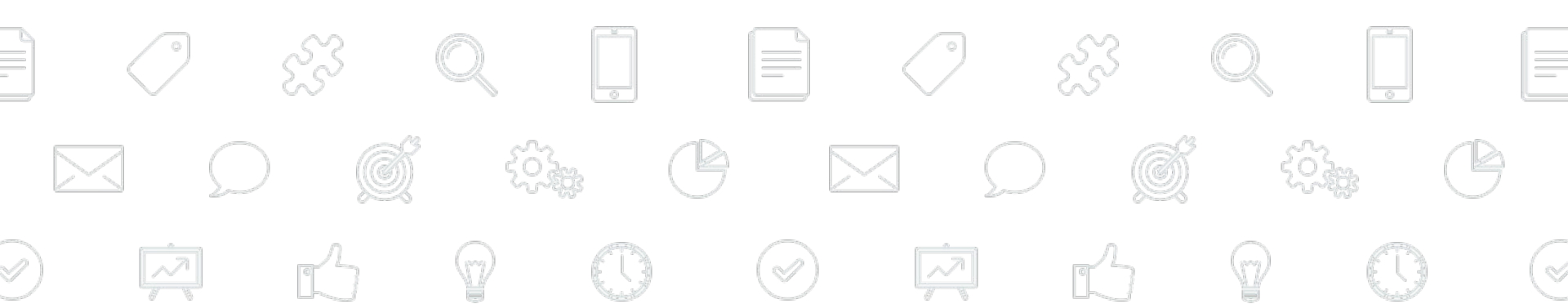

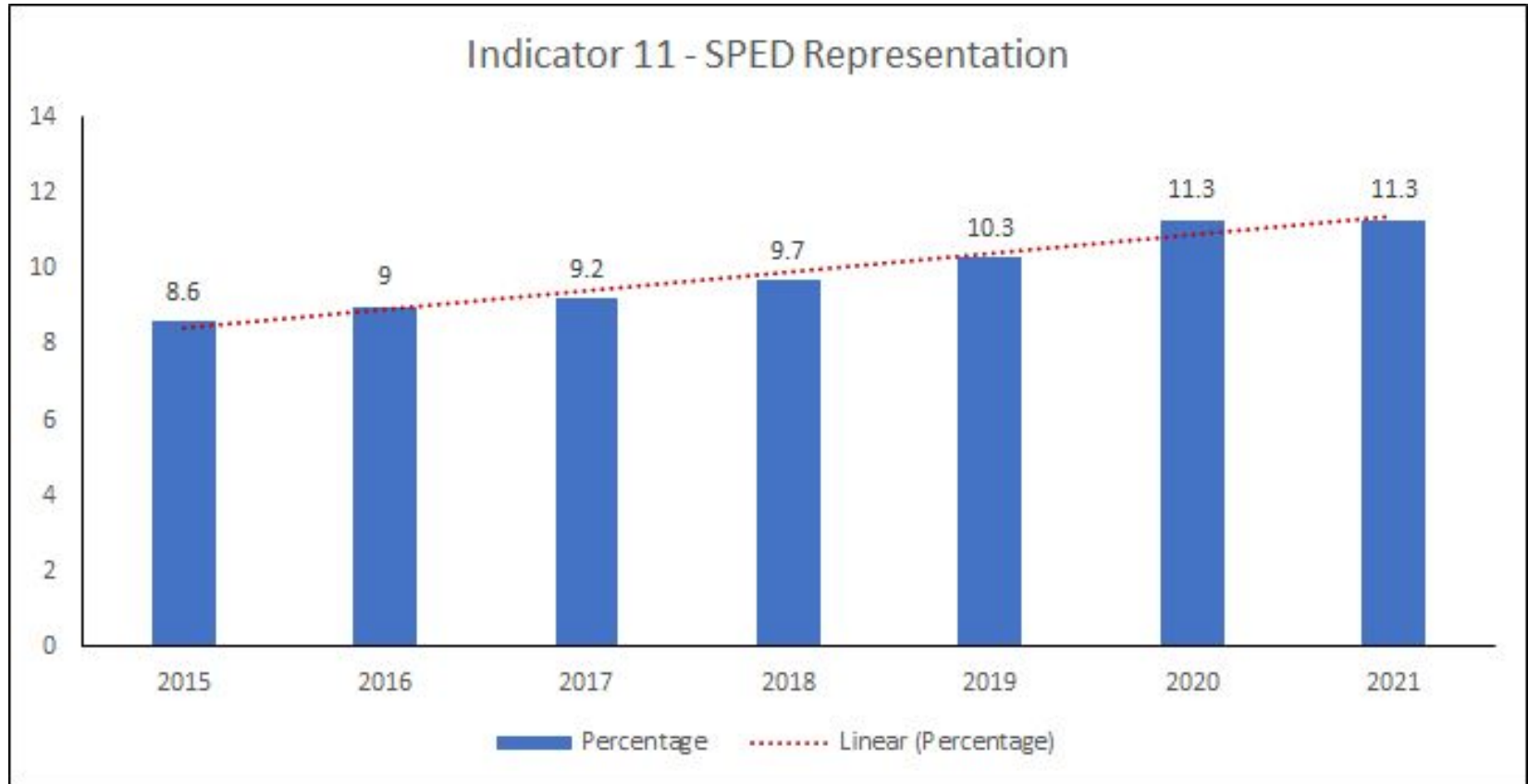

SPED Representation



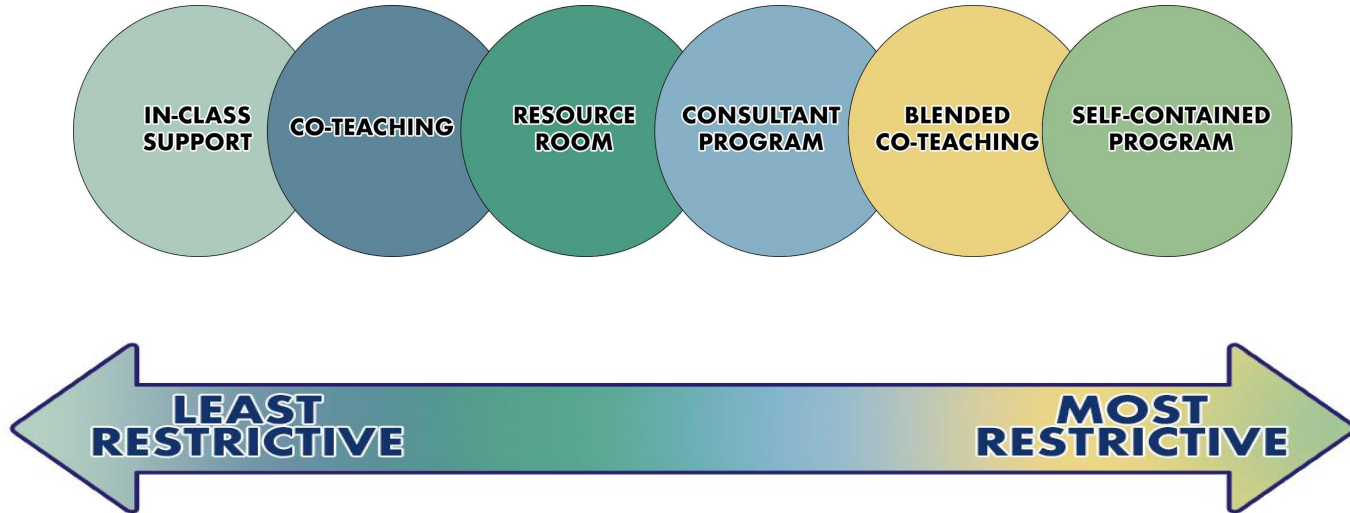
Anticipated SPED Representation for 21-22 school year

2022-23 Staff Development Waiver

Staff Development Waiver

- Allows the district to count time used for professional development toward the required 75,600 minutes
- Waiver provides 2,100 minutes that can be use for professional development in place of instruction up to 450 minutes per day
- Example - December 17th Early Release Day
 - Students are in school for 4 hours/15 minutes (255 minutes)
 - District uses 195 waiver minutes
 - School time + waiver minutes = 450 minutes for that day
