Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System

TELPAS measures the English acquisition in listening, speaking, reading and writing of K-12 students who are identified as limited English proficient. The TELPAS reading tests for English language learners (ELLs) in grades 2-12 was implemented in the spring 2008. The scores reported to districts in spring 2009 used the proficiency level cut points for the new assessments.
