New Direction High School

Keller ISD Disciplinary Alternative
Education Placement (DAEP)

DAEP

- Students from the home campuses who have been involved in a major discipline situation
- K-6 grade is our elementary program and 7-12 is our secondary program
- Still considered a part of their home campus

DAEP

We are here to help students make better decisions!

- Students attend an in-depth counseling program daily to provide them with the tools to help themselves make better decisions.
- Additional teaching in the areas of math and science.
- Opportunities for community service for first time offenders to allow students time served for giving back to the community.

New Direction High School

- Enroll as a New Direction High School student after an application process
- Can attend a morning, afternoon or a combined session
- Accountable for TAKS and AYP
- Can now graduate under a minimum or recognized graduation plan

New Direction High School (Stats)

- In 2008, 42 students graduated from New Direction High School
- In 2009, 36 students graduated from NDHS (1st year for Soph and Fresh)
 - Graduation rate in the low 20's in previous years
- 95% of the students at ND are on track by credits to graduate on time
- 100% At-Risk campus
- Drop out rate has reduced from 12.1% to 2.1%

New Direction High School Opportunities

- In Depth counseling programs to get students financial and in providing emotional support
- Involvement in campus and district events
- Opportunities for credit recovery and acceleration
- Serviced based projects (pennies for patients, campus appearance improvement, etc...)
- And many more campus programs and projects

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How we are helping the district?

- Night School Credit recovery
 - 2008 – 45 students participated / 45 earned credits
 - 2009 – 92 students participated / 87 earned credits
- Provide A+ serviced to all High School campuses currently using our model of credit recovery
- Flexible School Day Option
