Reading

- Make inferences about text using textual evidence to support understanding.
- Retell important events in stories in logical order.
- Identify moral lessons as themes in well-known fables, legends, myths, or stories.
- Compare different versions of the same story in traditional and contemporary folktales with respect to their characters, settings, and plot

Word Study

- I can understand adverbs (e.g. time: before, next; manner: carefully, beautifully), and prepositions and prepositional phrases and use these parts of speech in the context of reading writing and speaking.

Math

- I can solve one-step and multi-step word problems involving addition and subtraction within 1,000 using a variety of strategies based on place value, including algorithms
- I can generate and solve problem situations for a given mathematical number sentence involving addition and subtraction of whole numbers within 1,000
- I can determine the value of a collection of coins up to one dollar.

Questions to ask:

- What strategy is most effective for me to solve this problem?
- Why is it important to know a variety of ways to solve a problem?

Writing*ongoing skill-Not Mastery

- Write literary texts to express their ideas and feelings about real or imagined people, events, and ideas.
- Write short poems that convey sensory details. Students write legibly and use appropriate capitalization and punctuation conventions in their compositions.
- Plan a first draft by generating ideas for writing (e.g., drawing, sharing ideas, listing ideas).

Questions to ask while reading:

- What do effective readers do?
- How does what and why I read influence how I read?
- How do readers make meaning of text?
- What is meant but isn't being said?

Science

- I can identify and compare the properties of natural sources of freshwater and saltwater
