WHAT IS MAKERSPACE?

Makerspace is a place where all early childhood students could explore their passions using raw materials, tools, technology, repurposed items and their imagination. Young children can work collaboratively in ways that are open ended, exploratory, and self directed.

WHO WOULD PARTICIPATE IN THE EARLY CHILDHOOD MAKERSPACE PROGRAM?

All students at the Keller Early Learning Centers would participate. The students meet specific qualifications to attend school.
