




PBIS is Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports.

It is a proactive approach to establishing the behavioral supports and social culture needed for all students in a school to achieve social, emotional and academic success!






Panther Bucks- Teachers will reward students with Panther Bucks to earn rewards in common areas (hallway, lunchroom, recess, dismissal, etc.)

ATTENDANCE




Recess 11:00-11:30

If it is too hot or cold, we will have indoor recess. In the colder months, all extremeties must be covered to go outside. Please make sure your student has a jacket and pants in the winter.




If your child wants to bring a ball for recess, check with the teacher first. Please label all items brought to school. We do not allow other toys in first grade.

REPORT CARDS

What is a Standards-Based Report Card?

The essential components of an effective standards-based system include:

- Grade-level content standards (TEKS); 1.
- Standards-based curriculum and instruction; 2.
- Student success criteria that allows teachers to accurately communicate 3. each student's progress toward meeting the grade level standards; and,
- Effective feedback focused upon continuous growth. 4.

Classroom instruction includes all grade level standards (TEKS) however, the standards-based report card will focus upon specific process, supporting, and readiness standards that are critical for academic success.
