## What is Title I?

- Title I is a K-12 program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children.
- Schools that have higher than $40 \%$ of their students receiving free or reduced lunch qualify for federal funds.
- The program is intended to help ensure that all students meet state academic standards.


## Title I Funds [Federal Funds]

Allocated on basis of number of students eligible for free/reduced lunch. Schools receive Title I funds if 40\% or more of students are eligible for free/reduced lunch.

One percent of a school's total Title I budget is for parent involvement activities. Funds must supplement, not supplant, district funds.
(The term "supplement, not supplant" usually means that federal funds cannot be used to perform a service typically paid for with state or local funds.)
