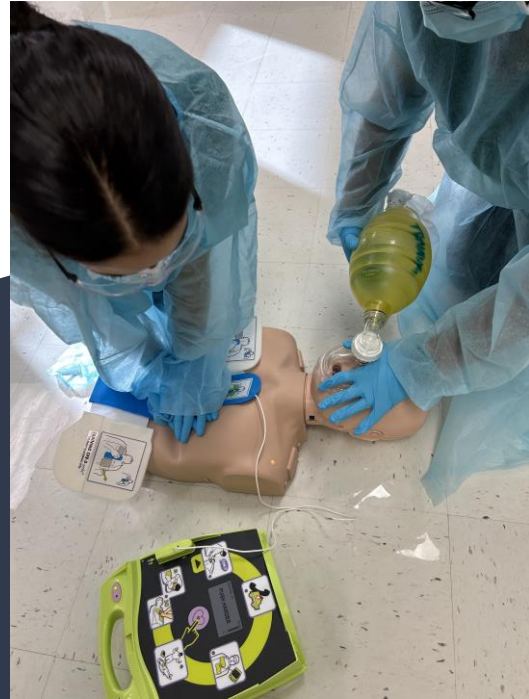

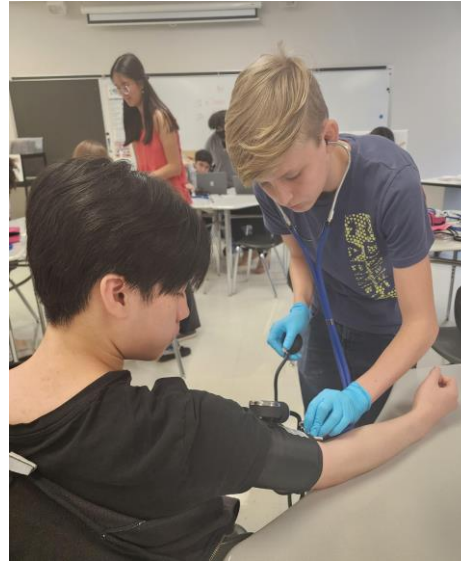
About the PCT Program



- Provides students the development of advanced knowledge and skills related to a wide variety of health careers and settings.
- As a Patient Care Technician, students will be trained to perform clinical procedures under the supervision of licensed health professionals. Some basic procedures include: assisting the physician or nurse, performing basic laboratory tests, obtaining specimens and vital signs.
- The PCT course provides the opportunity for students to take a National Certification Exam for Patient Care Technician.

PCT Skills

- Grooming/Dressing
- Bed Bath
- Oral Care
- Shaving
- Bed Making
- Toileting
- Weighing
- Obtaining Vital Signs
- Removing Peripheral IV

PCT Program Costs

- Certified Patient Care Technician Exam (\$155)- Paid for by KISD.
- Certified Patient Care Technician Online Study Guide/Practice Exams (\$69) - Paid for by KISD
- Drug Screen (\$40) – Any Lab Now
- TB Test (1 required) – **price varies based on Insurance**
- PCT Cord (\$13) - optional
- PCT Pin (\$3.50) - optional
- Program Scrubs (\$50/set) **2 sets recommended (black pants made be used from Sophomore year)
- Stethoscope (\$10)
- Black or White non-skid tennis shoes (*varies*)



Summer Requirements

 - Must order the required program top from Level 1
 - Scrub pants can come from Level 1 or a store and style of your choosing

Testing

- Students may test a year before high school graduation.
 - They do not have to be 18 to test, however they must be within a year of graduation.
 - Students have a grace period of a month and can test in May.
-
- The last test students take, their final exam, will determine if Keller ISD pays for their test.
 - All students who make an 80 or above on their final will have their exam paid for by Keller ISD.
 - If they do not make an 80 it is the student's responsibility to pay for their test.
-
- We are looking at testing in June to ensure a full year is reached.
 - Students must show up on the day selected by Keller ISD to have their test paid for.
