  - Verbiage of safety update is very broad
- Testing Results as a whole
  - Math: 48% or greater meet target, 38% are considered high achievement
  - o Reading: 25% or greater meet target, 35% are considered high achievement
    - Question asked if the hybrid class could be skewing this data
- ELA Curriculum Change
  - New curriculum will be purchased, possibly in Feb/Mar for next school year
  - New curriculum will have the same model; focusing on student independence
    - Visual showing lessons will have teacher guided practice → guided practice → teacher release → student works independently; workshop model
