

You will be taking your AP Exam(s) soon.

You should bring the following items to the exam room:

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers for all responses on your multiple-choice answer sheet. (Students outside the U.S.: bring HB or No. 2 pencils.)
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- Your 6-digit school code. Homeschooled students will be provided with their state's or country's homeschool code at the time of the exam.
- A watch that does not have internet access, does not beep, and does not have an alarm.
- Up to two approved calculators with the necessary capabilities if you're taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam. Visit exploreap.org/calculatorpolicy to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams and for a list of authorized calculators.
- A ruler or straightedge **only** if you're taking an AP Physics Exam. Protractors are not allowed.
- Your AP Student Pack.
- Bring a current government-issued or school-issued ID.

You should not bring the following to the exam room*:

- Electronic equipment (cell phone, smartphone, smartwatch, laptop, tablet computer, etc.), portable listening or recording devices (MP3 player, iPod, etc.), cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, or other electronic or communication devices.
- Books, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, No. 3 pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, or colored pencils.
- Scratch paper; notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets.
- Protractors, rulers or straightedges (except as noted above).
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Ear plugs.
- Clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- Food or drink.
- Calculators (except as noted above)

*Unless this has been preapproved as an accommodation by the College Board Services for Students with Disabilities office prior to the test date.

You are required to arrive no later than 30 minutes prior to your exam: 7:30 a.m. for the morning administration and 11:45 a.m. for the afternoon administration. Students may not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam. If you play a sport or have a job, it is your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly.

Get a good night's rest before your exam, and eat a nutritious breakfast. You are allowed to bring a snack and beverage for your 10-minute break. However, food and drink are prohibited in the exam room. It is advisable to bring a sweater, in case the room temperature is below your comfort level.

You are required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and Fossil Ridge High School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score.
