It takes a special kind of person to work in human services. Although many jobs in the cluster pay well, those who choose Human Services generally don't do it for the money. Instead, they are motivated by the desire to assist others. Psychologists, therapists, counselors, social workers, health aides, cosmetologists, financial planners, clergy members, and others tend to the physical, mental, and spiritual needs of people in their hometowns. They offer helping hands to everyone from babies in child-care centers to seniors in long-term care facilities. The work is sometimes challenging, but the reward of knowing that you have improved someone's life is immense. If you feel a calling to serve your fellow men and women, feel comfortable caring for people, or want to improve your community, then Human Services could be the right career cluster for you.

In the Cosmetology pathway, students will learn hair care, hair design, nail technology, skin care, facials, hair coloring, chemical reformation, salon development, and much more. They will have the opportunity to earn a Texas Cosmetology Operator License at the end of their courses. From there they can begin working as a licensed cosmetologist in the state of Texas

Introduction to Cosmetology (TEDS: 13025100 / KISD: 82200)

Students explore areas such as bacteriology, sterilization and sanitation, hair styling, manicuring, shampooing and the principles of hair cutting, hair styling, hair coloring, skin care, and facial makeup. The student researches careers in the personal care services industry. To prepare for success, students must have skills relative to this industry, as well as academic knowledge and skills. Students may begin to earn clock hours toward state licensing requirements. Class is taught at the Keller Center for Advanced Learning.

Cosmetology I / Cosmetology I Lab Innovative (TEDS: 13025210 / KISD: 83201)

Students coordinate integration of academic, career, and technical knowledge and skills in this laboratory instructional sequence course designed to provide job-specific training for employment in cosmetology careers. Instruction includes sterilization and sanitation procedures, hair care, nail care, and skin care and meets the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation requirements for licensure upon passing the state examination. Analysis of career opportunities, requirements, expectations, and development of workplace skills are included. Class is taught at the Keller Center for Advanced Learning.

Cosmetology II (TEDS: 13025300 / KISD: 82202)

Students review academic knowledge and skills related to cosmetology. This course is designed to provide advanced training for employment in cosmetology careers. Instruction includes training in sterilization and sanitation processes, hair care, nail care and skin care and meets the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation requirements for licensure upon passing the state examination. Students apply, combine, and justify knowledge skills to a variety of settings and problems. Class is taught at the Keller Center for Advanced Learning concurrently with Nail Care, Enhancements, and Spa Services.

Nail Care, Enhancements, and Spa Services (TEDS: N1302531 / KISD: 82204)

This course provides students additional lab time to develop proficient and mastery level cosmetology skills and techniques as required by Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation licensing standards. Students are expected to develop proficient and mastery level work samples and to expand their work experiences. Class is taught at the Keller Center for Advanced Learning concurrently with Cosmetology II.

Hours / Kit:

- Students must acquire 1,000 instruction hours as required by Texas Department of License & Regulation (TDLR).
 - Annual Kit Fee (Cost incurred by student/family) *Cost approximate. Supplies will be owned by student.*
 - *Softmore Year: \$125 - \$150*
 - *Junior Year: \$1,275 - \$1,350*
 - *Senior Year: \$680 - \$750 (Plus Licenses and testing cost \$200)*
