Pep Rallies/College Signings

Private lessons for Extracurricular activities

Completing extra credit/work for another course

Illness without a doctor's note

Miscellaneous day(s) off as excused only by parent

College/University visit days

Important Reminders

Must attend *at least* 85% of class meetings

Contact professor as soon as possible if you're going to be absent

Just because you are excused by the high school does **NOT** mean you're excused from your college courses

Must attend TCC classes at regular time during altered bell schedules due to pep rallies or testing

Get to class on time

Ensures you won't miss pertinent information, important assignments, and quizzes.



Unprepared students waste class time, and often ask questions that would've been answered if they completed their assignments.

Read course syllabus

Ensures you will understand the course, required supplies, class expectations, important dates, and other information.



Turn off cell phones

Cell phones can easily distract those around you, in addition to disengaging you from the learning environment.

No social media

The use of social media and text messaging can be very disruptive. Family and friends need to respect your class time and desire to learn.



Turn in work <u>on time</u>

Plan ahead. Last minute problems do occur, and it is still your responsibility to complete and submit assignments by the deadline.




Respect other's opinions

Respect your instructor

Assignments, classroom activities, and course policies are at the prerogative of the instructor. Discuss any issues you have with him/her privately.

STUDYING & HOMEWORK

HIGH SCHOOL

May receive reminders about assignments, deadlines, & missed work

May study as little as o-2hrs per week

Information is often written on the board to be copied into your notes

Teacher will reach out if they believe you are struggling

Expected to complete short assignments that are then re-taught in class

Will usually be told in class what you need to learn from assigned readings

COLLEGE

Expected to refer to syllabus and/or Blackboard for assignments & deadlines

Study 2-3hrs for every hour of class time

May lecture non-stop, expecting you to identify important points in your notes

Student must reach out to professor about missing assignments or for help

Assigned substantial amount of reading which may not be addressed in class

It's up to you to read and understand the assigned material

An act or instance of using or closely imitating the language, thoughts, [and ideas] of another without authorization and the representation of that work as one's own, as by not crediting the originator.

PLAGIARISM INCLUDES:

Directly quoting, summarizing, or paraphrasing the ideas of others without identification of the sources

Buying or selling of other's work and submitting as your own

Copying sentences or paragraphs but tweaking words in an effort to avoid plagiarism detection

Submitting your own work from a previous or current class without obtaining prior consent from your instructor

You are able to withdraw from a course and receive a grade of "W" on your transcript. This does not affect your college GPA.




