

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




College Visits





A senior student's absence of up to two days related to visiting a college or university will be considered an absence exemption, provided the student follows the campus procedures to verify such a visit, and makes up any work missed.







How to Apply

- Completely fill out the application
- 2. Request that your high school transcript be sent to the college (use the KISD online form)
- Send your SAT or ACT scores to the college (if applicable)
- 4. Create an FSA ID & complete the FAFSA(opens in December 2023)
- 5. Apply for campus specific scholarships. This may require a separate application
- 6. Apply for scholarships that could be used at any college
- 7. Pay attention to application <u>and</u> scholarship deadlines
- 8. Follow up to ensure all required documents have been received by the college or university (check your email often!)









At Texas schools, you will need to submit scores or take the TSI to be able to register for classes.





- Register with NCAA
- Register with NAIA
- Confirm with your counselor that you are on track with the classes you take for NCAA (4 X 4 Curriculum)
- Send official KISD transcript to NCAA or NAIA
- Send your official SAT or ACT scores to NCAA or NAIA
- Pay registration fees (or use fee waivers if eligible)





Transcripts

- Colleges will need a copy of a student's transcript to admit the student. Request these when you apply to colleges.
- Students receive two free orders, so add multiple schools to the first order to cover all your applications. The second order is your final transcript.
- After high school graduation, students will need to submit a final (official) transcript to the college where they will attend.
- Students should begin requesting final transcripts in mid-May










3 Types of Federal Student Aid









Borrowed money.

Loans are an investment in your future. But remember, they must be repaid with interest.



Earned money.

A work-study job lets you earn money while you're in school.







EAFSA

(Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

No matter what your financial situation, it is *strongly* recommended that you complete the FAFSA.

It is required by *all* colleges for students to be eligible for financial aid.

Normally, the application opens October 1 every year. It will open sometime in December this year due to a large update to the application process.

Completing a FAFSA (or TASFA) is now a graduation requirement in the state of Texas.



What is the TASFA?

- Texas Application for State Financial Aid
- For students classified as Texas residents who are not eligible to complete the FAFSA
- Used to determine eligibility for state financial aid
