

Keller ISD Student COVID-19 Process Map

Student has symptoms and tests positive OR suspected to have COVID-19 OR awaiting personal test results.

Parent/Student reports while at school.

Parent/Student reports while at home.

Student reports to nurse and leaves to get medical care or call 911 if life threatening symptoms. Isolate if unable to immediately leave building.

Nurse contacts campus principal or designee, completes contact tracing, document case on campus COVID reporting Google sheet for Dir. of Health Services.

Nurse contacts principal or designee and counselor for learning environment support.

Student/parent should contact their primary care physician and self-isolate at home for at least 10 calendar days from symptom onset and experiences at least 48 hours of no fever without fever-reducing medication.

Student tests positive, but has no symptoms.

Parent/Student reports to attendance clerk/nurse.

Nurse contacts principal or designee, completes contact tracing, documents on campus COVID reporting Google sheet for Dir. of Health Services.

Student/parent should contact their primary care physician and self-isolate at home for at least 10 calendar days since testing positive. Student can return to school after 10 calendar days of self-isolation, as long as no symptoms develop.

Student reports someone at home has symptoms OR someone at home has tested positive OR awaiting test results.

Parent/Student reports to attendance clerk/nurse.

Nurse contacts principal or designee and counselor for learning environment support.

Student/parent should contact their primary care physician, self-isolate, and avoid public spaces for 10 calendar days after the last date of exposure. The additional 10-calendar-day quarantine period begins after the person in the home is cleared. The student should monitor for symptoms and contact primary care physician if they develop symptoms. (May return sooner with negative test result and written medical clearance.)

Student has prolonged exposure to someone who has tested positive or has symptoms.

Parent/Student reports to attendance clerk/nurse.

Nurse contacts principal or designee and counselor for learning environmental support.

Parent/Student should contact their primary care physician, self-isolate, and avoid public spaces for 10 calendar days after the last date of exposure. The quarantine period begins after the person in the home is cleared. Student should be monitored for symptoms and contact primary care physician, if they develop symptoms.

Student reports someone in their home was exposed to someone who tested positive or has symptoms.

If the someone at home is not symptomatic, but just "exposed," continue with in-person learning. No need to self-isolate.

To be considered exposed to COVID-19, you need to have prolonged close contact with a person who has the virus. Close contact includes:

- Living in the same household caring for a sick person with the virus,
- Being within six feet of a sick person with the virus for at least 15 cumulative minutes, or
- Being in direct contact with secretions from a sick person without wearing appropriate PPE.
