Do	Don't
Celebrate Black history and culture through literature, poetry, dance, music, innovation, science, technology, and art	Appropriate the culture through language, dress, etc. as a means of making a connection
Invite a Black Sorority or Fraternity to visit or zoom with students to share their culture	Rely on members of the Black community to <i>teach</i> you- self reflection and interest driven learning is important for staff as well as students
Celebrate Black culture and joy as a means of empowerment	Don't <i>only</i> talk about the trauma of Black History.
Involve students	Force students to be involved
Incorporate Black history and culture into the entire school day, in all content areas	Limit BHM to electives
Invite students who are Black or Afro-Latinx to share something that represents their culture via video/presentation/live stream	Rely on Black students to represent the entirety of Black culture- don't view them as a monolith
Create space for students to celebrate their culture all year long	Limit cultural studies to a single month of the year
