ACT vs SAT: What's the difference?

- ▶ The SAT is a test of reading, writing & language, and math. The scores range from 400 to 1600 (200-800 for reading, writing, & language and 200-800 for math).
- ▶ The ACT is a test of English, math, science, reading, and writing. The highest score is a 36. The writing section is optional.
- ▶ Both tests are about the same time length--around 3 hours, adding 40 minutes with the ACT essay. They are also similar in cost (unless you add ACT writing).

When should I take the tests?

- ▶ Most students take these tests in their junior year of high school. Each test offers 7 test dates per year.
- ▶ Sophomore year is not too early, especially if you want to take the tests, then do a prep course, then take them again. But you can do this plan junior year instead if you choose.
- ▶ However, you will do better if you have completed algebra II and English III first.
- ▶ The latest I recommend taking a test is the summer at the end of junior year. Senior year is risky to be taking the tests for the first time while trying to apply for college and scholarships.
