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



How to Apply


- 1. Completely fill out the application
- 2. Request that your high school transcript be sent to the college (use the online form from your high school campus)
- 3. Send your SAT or ACT scores to the college (if applicable)
- 4. Create an FSA ID & complete the FAFSA
- 5. Apply for campus specific scholarships. This may require a separate application
- 6. Apply for scholarships that could be used at any college
- 7. Pay attention to application <u>and</u> scholarship deadlines
- 8. Follow up to ensure all required documents have been received by the college or

university













- Study a little every day! Don't wait until the last minute to cram for the test. You will not get your best results!!




















Technical or Trade Schools

Transcripts





- Colleges will need a copy of a student's transcript to admit the student.
- After high school graduation, students will need to submit a final (official) transcript to the college where they will attend.
- Students should begin requesting final transcripts in mid-May

- <u>Do not sign paperwork</u> without discussing with your parents








Financial Aid is money (grants, loans, scholarships and work study) that helps defray the overall cost of your college education.


No matter what your financial situation, it is *strongly recommended* that you complete the FAFSA.

It is required by *all* colleges for students to be eligible for financial aid.

Normally, the application opens October 1 every year. It will open sometime in December this year due to a large update to the application process.

Completing a FAFSA (or TASFA) is now a graduation requirement in the state of Texas.





- Texas Application for State

- Used to determine eligibility for state financial aid

TASFA Completion Basics

Very similar to the FAFSA

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- Available in English and Spanish
- State priority application deadline: January 15
- Submit directly to the college financial aid office
- Available online beginning fall 2022

Texas Application for State Financial Aid

July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022

The Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TLSAF) is a free application that collects information to help determine eligibility for state (in institutional) in financial aid programs administed by Nistitutions of higher decuston in the state of Texas. Student classified as Texas residents who are not eligibility for state who FAFSA filling requirements, with filling avor or constrt. The state financial aid priority application deadline for many institutions of higher education is January 15, 2021 for the 2021-22 award year. In order to be considered for the most financial aid that may be available to you, it is important to complete and submit this application with all required documentation to the financial aid office on or before Jan. 15. Note: Texas residency and final eligibility for financial aid can only be determined by the institution that you plan to attend.

To complete this application, answer each item within each section. If a question does not apply to you, answer M/A for not appletolise/E- for clarification or certain items, refer to the TASA houses on pages 6.4. If you have further questions about this form, contact the financial aid office at your institution. Some institutions have an online version of the TASAF, check with your institution before filling out the pdf or paper version. Note: Personal information collected on the TASAF is protected under the Family foundational fights and Privacy Act (FRPA) of 1374.
