

The District serves approximately 35,000 students in portions of the cities of Colleyville, Fort Worth, Haltom City, Hurst, North Richland Hills, Southlake, Watauga, Westlake and the entire City of Keller. Its 51 square miles encompass the third-largest land area in Tarrant County.

KISD has 18 campuses that have implemented the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework. AVID believes that all students can achieve with rigorous academic preparedness, opportunity knowledge.

ROCK (Reaching Out with Character and Kindness) Keller ISD believes that a safe and civil environment is necessary for all students to learn and attain their highest academic standards. The ROCK program provides anti-bullying education and programming for students, families, and employees in an effort to eliminate disruptive behaviors in KISD.

Advanced Academics

Through advanced academic services, we serve approximately 3,500 students each year. We began to support our middle school GT students through a new service during advisory, called "Illuminate." Illuminate gives middle school students access to a directed GT curriculum supporting their gifted characteristics and need for connection to future learning pathways. Additionally, our team of specialists are continuing to ensure equitable access to advanced opportunities for populations who are historically under-identified through directed professional learning, Title 1 services and supports, and enhanced screening opportunities. Keller ISDs advanced academic and GT opportunities include Spark, Excel, Illuminate, as well as subject and grade-level Acceleration.

Dual Language Programs

Keller ISD is committed to providing effective



Best Communities for Music Education - The NAMM Foundation has named Keller ISD one of its Best Communities for Music Education for eight consecutive years. The Best Communities for Education designation is awarded to school districts that demonstrate outstanding achievement in efforts to provide music education to all students.

Park Glen ES and PGES PTA Recognized Nationally as School of Excellence - National PTA recognized Park Glen Elementary and the Park Glen PTA as a 2020-22 School of Excellence for their accomplishments in building a strong, effective family-school partnership that is enriching the educational experience and overall well-being for all students. National PTA's School of Excellence program is a year-long commitment to improving family-school partnerships through opening the lines of communication and critical thinking within school communities to make data-driven decisions yielding positive, long-term results.

Keller Shake Competition Returns, LSES Student Named Champion - After taking a year off due to COVID-19 protocols, the Keller ISD Fine Arts Department's Keller Shake competition returned in 2021-22. Keller Shake is a competition held throughout the District's elementary school theatre classes, where students learn the value of voice, diction, eye contact, and a firm (though, this year, optional) handshake. The emphasis is on educating the whole child with a greater understanding of conversational and social skills. This year's winner was Lone Star Elementary student Cooper Stine, while Eagle Ridge's Amerie Sargent finished second and Parkview's Aubrey Ferguson finished third.





Bear Creek Student Advances to Scripps National Spelling Bee for Second Straight Year

Bear Creek Intermediate School sixth-grader Vivinsha Veduru won the 2022 Texas Christian University Scripps Regional Spelling Bee and earned a spot in the Scripps National Beel for the second straight year. In 2021, Vivinsha also won the Regional Bee and advanced all the way to the Finals of the National Bee in Orlando, Fla., televised by ESPN, where she was one of the last six remaining spellers in the country, eventually finishing in a tie for fourth place.

State Champions in Swimming, Powerlifting, Cheerleading

Keller High School swimmer Cooper Lucas won a pair of Class 6A State Championships, winning the 200-Yard Freestyle and 500-Yard Freestyle races. Central High School's Ruthie Sanchez won a State Championship in powerlifting for the second straight year. Fossil Ridge High School's Co-Ed Cheerleading squad won its third consecutive UIL 6A Spirit State Championship. Keller High's volleyball team also advanced to the UIL Class 6A State Championship match, finishing as State Runner-Up.

CHS History Teacher Finalist for Outstanding Teacher of American History

Central High School AP US History Teacher Steve Patty was recognized as a Finalist for the Texas Daughters of the American Revolution's Outstanding Teacher of American History recognition. Patty has taught at CHS for 16 years, teaching AP US History for the past 13 years, and serves as the Social Studies Department Chair at the school. He was recognized at the TXDAR State Conference Education Luncheon where he placed third overall.

Teachers of the Year

Keller ISD's Teachers of the Year for 2021-22 were Heritage Elementary School Teacher Jenne Brauchle-Nguyen, and Central High School Teacher Gerald Sledge.





There are 4,286 students in Keller ISD identified as having a disability which would necessitate special education services. More than 85% of those students spend more than 75% of their day in a general education classroom. Special Education is 12.3% of the Keller ISD student population. Between 2016 and 2022, the District increased by 1351 students, which was a 43.6% increase.

The success of our students is largely due to the efforts of our team of special education teachers, para-professionals, and staff. Keller ISD has 304 Special Education Teachers, 313 Paraprofessionals, 46 Diagnosticians, 8 ARD Facilitators, 12 LSSPs, 43 Speech Language Pathologists, 8 Speech Language Pathologists Assistants, three Licensed Professional Counselors, five Board Certified Behavior Analysts, 12 Occupational Therapists, two Physical Therapists, one Physical Therapist Assistant, one Teacher of Deaf/HH, one Audiologist, two Music Therapists, three Visual Impairment Specialists, one Orientation and Mobility Specialist, two Adaptive Physical Education Teachers, one Assistive Technology Specialist, 6 Program Specialists, three District Wide Special Education Teachers, 7 Inclusion Learning Teachers, and one Parent Liaison.

Keller ISD's Collegiate Academy opened its doors in the fall of 2021. Students will have the opportunity to pursue an associate degree in partnership with TCC in the field of healthcare. Our students can choose pathways that range from general associate degrees that will prepare them for continuing at a four-year university, to pursuing specific career pathways in the healthcare field, such as nursing. Open to all students in Keller ISD through an application process, this unique

opportunity will allow students to graduate with Texas Education Agency's high school requirements and up to 60 college credit hours at little-to-no cost to students.

The Keller ISD Education Foundation funds Educator Grants each year to support out-of-the-box teaching ideas that help educators find newer and better ways to educate the children of Keller ISD. These grants facilitate unique and creative approaches that encourage higher levels of student learning, stimulate creativity, and expand the existing curriculum. In 2022, the Foundation awarded \$49,855 in grants to 28 educators throughout KISD.

Through a strong partnership, the KISD Education Foundation also helps the students of Keller ISD attain the goals they desire by enriching their educational experiences. This year, thanks to the Foundation's generous \$25,000 donation, KISD awarded full or partial scholarships to 244 students taking Advanced Placement exams in the spring of 2022. In addition, the Foundation provided 16 scholarships totaling \$21,000 to well-rounded graduating seniors to use at an accredited college, university, community college or trade school.

Keller Council of PTAs

Recognized for having one of the strongest PTAs in the State of Texas, the Keller Council of PTA's mission is to make every child's potential a reality by engaging and empowering families and communities to advocate for all children. PTA provides and promotes educational programs for parents and students, family engagement, arts in education, campus activities, assemblies, advocacy for legislation in support of quality education, safety measures and finance, as well as college scholarships, and district-wide student educational financial support through Casey's Kids.

Greater Keller Chamber of Commerce

The Greater Keller Chamber of Commerce is an independent, nonprofit organization that brings together more than 500 businesses throughout Keller ISD. The Keller Chamber supports various KISD initiatives throughout the year, such as sponsoring Hillwood Middle School's Year-End Studies program and connecting local businesses to the college and career preparation opportunities taking place at the Keller Center for Advanced Learning and in CTE programs throughout the District.

The Storehouse assists children and families who face these and other challenges by providing a variety of educational services - including reading programs and school supplies and well-being with help in nutrition, clothing, and health care.
